
EMPower Partnerships in the Community




Quality Improvement Corner



Quality Improvement Toolbox

Spaghetti Diagrams



Spaghetti Diagrams can be used to show equipment and personnel movement through an area. They are created by following the "thing" that is flowing through the process and documenting observed motion on a floor plan of the space. Spaghetti Diagrams can be used to:

- Show wasted motion in a work area and uncover clues as to where improvement opportunities lie
- Identify where sections of the workspace may not be set up optimally
- Help brainstorm how to improve the layout of equipment, supplies, and people to reduce unnecessary motion (often steps by staff or patients)
- Show improvements through "before" and "after" diagram

Some EMPower hospitals are already using Spaghetti Diagrams to improve and show the value of rooming-in!
